CLASS INTERRUPTIONS

- I. Principals shall be responsible for limiting disruption to instructional time.
- II. Principals shall not permit organizations seeking memberships to solicit students during instructional time.
 - A. Schools shall consider only those organizations approved by the Superintendent of Schools or his designee.

- B. Principals shall ensure that organizations meet with students during non-instructional times.
- C. All materials intended for distribution must be approved in accordance with Policy File: KJB.
- III. Principals shall not permit organizations seeking fundraising from students to solicit students during instructional time.
 - A. Schools shall consider only those fundraising activities approved by the Superintendent of Schools or his designee.
 - B. Principals shall ensure that special assemblies or meetings are not held for the purpose of fundraising.
 - C. Any materials intended for distribution must be approved by the Superintendent of Schools or his designee.
 - D. Fundraising campaigns sending students door-to-door are prohibited.
- IV. Schools are permitted to use minimal instructional time to engage in fundraising meetings in support of the instructional program.
 - A. Principals shall approve all fundraising activities for instructional purposes.
 - B. Examples of this regulation included school pictures, yearbooks, class rings and book fairs.
- V. Contracted services arranged by community agencies and/or parents shall not be delivered during instructional time, except as approved by the principal.
- VI. Schools should restrict interruptions to instructional time including, but not limited to, routine extracurricular activities, requests for students to leave class, phone calls, public address announcements, and other non-emergency situations.
